



HOOD RIVER COUNTY PARKS

RULES AND POLICIES

Check-in & Check-out

- Check-in time is noon on the day of arrival. Early check-in subject to site availability.
- Check-out by noon on the day of departure.

Site Occupancy

- Maximum four (4) adults per site, except for group sites.
- Each site is permitted either one tent, one RV/van, or one vehicle with trailer: plus one additional tent and non-sleeping vehicle.
- Sites uninhabited for more than 24 hours will be considered abandoned.

Stay Limits

- Maximum stay is seven (7) consecutive days and 30 days in a season. See host for exceptions.

Operating Hours

- Picnic shelters and day-use areas open during daylight hours only.
- No camping or overnight parking is allowed in day-use areas.
- Visitors are not allowed in camping areas during quiet hours.

Quiet Hours

- Quiet Hours are between 10:00 PM and 7:00 AM.

Vehicles & Speed Limits

- Park only in designated areas. Do not block roadways, fire lanes, or adjacent campsites.
- Vehicles must be fully contained in parking area. Hood River County reserves the right to limit the number of vehicles allowed per site and their parking location.
- Speed limit inside the park is 10 MPH.

Pets

- Pets must be under owners' control at all times (6ft leash, vehicle, or kennel).
- Pets may not be left unattended.
- Pet owners are responsible for all waste cleanup and any damage caused by their animal.
- Only service animals are permitted inside park buildings.

Fires & Fireworks

- Fires permitted only in county-provided fire rings and fireplaces, or portable stoves and grills, at designated campsites or picnic areas.
- Fires must be attended by an adult at all times and fully extinguished before leaving.
- The park director may prohibit all fires at any time without prior notice. Observe all posted fire restrictions.
- Fireworks are strictly prohibited at all times.

Garbage & Grounds

- Deposit all garbage in designated dumpsters. Do not bring outside refuse into the park for disposal.
- Do not pollute lakes, streams, rivers, or grounds with garbage, litter, soap, detergent, wastewater, or fish waste.
- Tent and rug placement on lawn areas may be restricted to protect grass; follow staff direction.

Prohibited Items & Activities

- Disturbing wildlife.
- Possession of weapons outside a personal vehicle.
- Discharge of firearms, pellet guns, bows and arrows, slingshots, or any weapon.
- Damage to vegetation, structures, or facilities.
- Excavations, digging, moving dirt or rocks.
- Metal detectors.
- Chainsaws (except for authorized persons on official duty).
- Unauthorized commercial activity, vending, soliciting, or advertising of any kind.
- Public address (PA) systems or posting signs.
- Generators (campers requiring power should purchase an electrical hook-up site at Toll Bridge Park).
- Noises and lights disturbing to other campers, as determined by the sole discretion of staff or hosts.
- Disorderly conduct.

Liability & Right to Enter

- Hood River County is not responsible for loss, theft, injury, or property damage, including damage caused by natural hazards.
- Return your site to its pre-use condition upon departure. Damages may be billed to the responsible party.
- County staff reserve the right to enter any campsite to manage park property and enforce rules.

Emergency & After Hours

- In any emergency, call 911 immediately, then notify the Campground Host.

Other Applicable Laws & Regulations

- All Federal, State, and Hood River County laws and regulations apply within this park.
- Please familiarize yourself with applicable rules.
